Dear Parents,

Enclosed is a copy of the Sunday School material used in the Beginners' department. Children may start when they are 2 years old, no matter what day of the year their birthday falls on. You may come in with them if you desire. Included in this folder are the Catechism, verses, and songs we learn.

Some parents often ask why we have a Sunday School program for such little children. This is a very good question! First, little children can profit greatly from the word of God. The word of God is quick and lively, and the Holy Spirit uses the preached, taught, and memorized word, even in the smallest of the Church's members. We strive in our Sunday School class to be a help to parents by furthering their at-home Bible instruction with Sunday School instruction, often teaching and reinforcing the Scriptures many families read during their family devotions.

Second, the Children's Catechism is a valuable teaching tool, both in the home and at church. Parents can readily use the foundation the Catechism lays to answer their little ones' questions. And, of course, parents can draw upon the Scriptures their children have memorized for times of instruction, encouragement, or comfort. Some of the Catechism questions have challenging vocabulary or address a somewhat difficult concept for little ones to grasp. This is nothing to be concerned over. In fact, the memorized Scriptures and Catechism questions are now part of the children's "spiritual warehouse"—and while the understanding may not have caught up with the children yet, the seeds for instruction and growth have been sown, and a foundation has been laid for even deeper understanding in God's word.

And third, the Sunday School environment further helps the children develop into mature, active participants in the corporate worship service. In the classroom, we emphasize orderly, reverent behavior, participation in prayer and singing, and thoughtfulness for others.

The primary part of our Sunday School program is, of course, Bible teaching. Beginning in Genesis and ending with Revelation, we teach through the major stories of the Bible. Our heart's desire is that the children learn to know and love the Lord Jesus Christ through the Bible lessons. For the sake of orderliness, we follow (in general) the organization of Scripture stories laid out in Catherine Vos's *The Child's Story Bible*. The children's Sunday School papers reflect the day's lesson and makes a great springboard for discussion or review at home.

The children start by learning from the Children's Catechism. After they have learned the first 4-5 catechism questions, we will introduce Bible verses. It might take them several weeks to get a verse learned as speaking in sentences is a learning process. Work with them phrase by

phrase. Children learn best when learning phrase by phrase as opposed to word by word. For example, teach "In the beginning." When the child can say this, then teach, "God created." When they can say this, then put the two phrases together, "In the beginning, God created" then add, "the heavens and the earth." The littlest ones might have trouble with certain sounds, but don't worry as this is normal.

When they have mastered the catechism and/or verse, we will mark it off in our charts. They will then go on to the next verse or catechism. We will write their catechism number and verse for the next week on their coloring paper. That way, you can see whether your child said that week's verse. The children work at their own pace. Some have an easier time memorizing and some talk earlier. Enclosed is a check-off sheet so you can keep track of what catechism they are to work on. We don't expect perfection when they first start.

Upon completing a set of 10 questions, the children will review these questions. The second time through, they should strive to be word perfect. The children will also repeat all of the Bible verses once they have said them through all the way. The second time through on the Bible verses, they must say the reference as well. Longer sections of Scripture (Psalms, 23 and 100, Exodus 20, etc.) may be recited as large chunks once the children have learned all of the verses.

After the initial catechism is learned, and then reviewed, the children go on to the additional catechism questions. The Bible memory work will stay the same. If your child has memorized more than one verse or catechism question, or something other than scheduled, please send in a note to us so we can listen to what they have worked on.

Also enclosed are some of the songs we often sing. To teach the songs, use the same method as teaching the catechism and verses, singing phrase by phrase. You might want to start with "Jesus Loves Me."

If you have any questions or comments, please do not hesitate to talk to us. Feel free to come sit in the class, especially when your child first starts. Some bounce right in and some cry. Our desire is to help your child hide God's Word in their hearts.
